**CODE OF CONDUCT**

In order to ensure that the principles of sportsmanship, fair play, skill development, and mutual respect among players, parents, officials, and spectators are the primary considerations governing competition in the Kelseyville Youth Football League (KYFL), the following Code of Conduct has been established and adopted. As the parent/league guardian of the youth listed below, I hereby acknowledge that I and my guests will abide by the Code of Conduct listed below:

1. Anyone connected with KYFL, in any capacity will conduct themselves in an appropriate manner, so as to set a positive example for the players, parents, officials, and spectators.
  - a. Communicating with the Officials in an abusive or inappropriate manner is PROHIBITED.
  - b. Smoking, or using tobacco products (including vaporizers) in front of players, cheerleaders, during practice, games, or official team functions is strictly PROHIBITED.
  - c. Encouraging, tolerating, or indulging in substance abuse is strictly PROHIBITED.
  - d. Using or tolerating obscene language and/or gestures is strictly PROHIBITED.
  - e. Physically or verbally intimidating, abusing, or assaulting anyone is strictly PROHIBITED.
  - f. Making discriminatory remarks based on race, religion, gender, or national origin is strictly PROHIBITED.
  - g. Consuming or allowing consumption of alcohol, or be in an inebriated state during practices, games, or official team functions is strictly PROHIBITED. Open alcoholic beverages are PROHIBITED on the field, in the stands, or parking areas.
  - h. Approaching Coaches before, during, or after games with complaints are strictly PROHIBITED. Since the Mendo-Lake Empire Junior Football League (governing body) is a competitive league, the coaches have complete control over playing times of participants.
2. Parents are expected to volunteer at least 3 hours of their time per season at home games. Tasks include: snack bar, chain gang, garbage, etc. KYFL Director of Volunteer Operations will be coordinating volunteer activities.
3. While Coaches will not leave my child unattended, Parents are expected to pick up their child from practice, games and official team functions in a timely manner. As Coaches will not leave my child unattended, Coaches will be available 15 minutes before and after team functions.
4. Parents are expected to inform Coaches as soon as possible if their child will not be at a practice or game. Transportation to practices, games, and official team functions is the responsibility of the parents. Also, coaches and volunteers are not responsible for a child's personal items.
5. Parents are expected to read and abide by the Mendo-Lake Empire Junior Football League and the Kelseyville Youth Football League's bylaws. 6. Parents are encouraged to only post positive comments on the Social Media pages supported by Kelseyville Youth Football League.

I acknowledge the conditions of this Code of Conduct and understand that if anyone violates these rules, that they will be removed from the premises by Team Officials or Law Enforcement. If necessary, the player or cheerleader will be removed from the game until the individual has left the premises. Other sanctions may be enforced, as deemed appropriate by the President or Board of Directors of the Kelseyville Youth Football League, including being banned from a game, season, or permanently.
